#### Immediately After You Register:

**Review the meeting program** as early as possible and **register for ticketed sessions**—onsite availability for certain sessions will be extremely limited.

**Complimentary boxed lunches** are provided Thursday and Friday in the exhibit hall in addition to daily morning and afternoon refreshment breaks (10:30–11:15 a.m. – coffee break; 12:45–2:15 p.m. – lunch; 3:45–4:30 p.m. – afternoon refreshment break).

Hours of operation are Thursday, April 19, 8:30 a.m.–6:00 p.m.; Friday, April 20, 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m.; and Saturday, April 21, 8:00 a.m.–3:00 p.m.

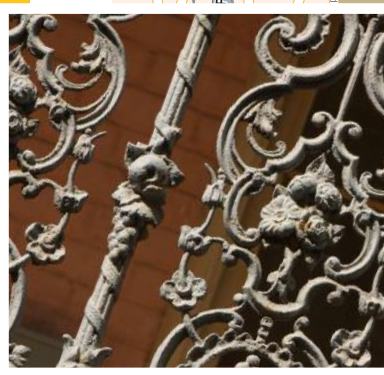


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## Visitor's Information

## Guide for International Attendees

### Useful Information for Travel to the United States

#### Telephones

All US phone numbers are composed of 10 digits. To call the United States from abroad, you need to dial the international code 00 + the US country code 1 (or +1). To call abroad from the United States, dial 00, followed by the country code, the city code (if applicable), and the number required.

#### Internet

In many hotels and public spaces, such as airports, restaurants, service stations, and shopping centers, there are duly indicated “wireless” or “Wi-Fi” zones, where it is possible to obtain wireless Internet access.

Free wireless Internet is available in meeting rooms and lobbies at the Convention Center.

#### Currency and Exchange

The official currency of the United States is the US dollar. One dollar is divided into 100 cents. There are four coins: 1 cent (penny), 5 cents (nickel), 10 cents (dime), and 25 cents (quarter). Dollar bills can be distinguished by their different values: 1, 5, 10, 20, 50, and 100 dollars. Currency can be exchanged in banks and exchange bureaus and may be withdrawn from automatic teller machines (ATMs).

In the United States, the most commonly used credit cards are Visa, American Express, and Master Card. In the event of loss or theft, contact:

#### Tipping

Tipping in the United States is customary. Adding 10-20% to the amount is regular practice in taxis, restaurants, and bars.

#### Transportation

**Shuttles:** Complimentary shuttle service is provided for all participants to and from the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center and official convention hotels. This is an important reason to reserve your hotel through ACP. The shuttle times and pickup locations can be found at [im2018.acponline.org/travel-housing](http://im2018.acponline.org/travel-housing). Please note, there is no mid-day service.

**Taxis:** Taxi service is available from the New Orleans International Airport to downtown. Approximate fare to a downtown destination, which includes all area hotels, is approximately \$30.00 to \$40.00.

#### Time Zone

New Orleans, LA is in the Central US time zone, CDT (GMT - 7 hours).

#### Electricity

Electric power is standardized in all states across the United States. It is set at 110 volts and 60 cycles. 220-volt power is used in homes only for large appliances like stoves, water heaters, and clothes dryers. If you bring any electrical appliance to the United States, you may need an adaptor to fit the electrical receptacles.
